Phase 1:

2009 - 2011

THE LAUNCH AND GAINING POPULARITY



In 2009, the 1St Edition of the Award was launched under the auspices of Chairman of Dubai Executive Council and Chairman of Dubai Sports Council H. H. Sheikh Hamdan Bin Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Being the first of its kind in the field of creative sports as an order of merit, the Award aims to bridge a huge sports gap in how to honor the sports talents for their achievements and to support efforts to develop and promote the various fields of the sports sector to reach world-class levels.

The Award, in its first stage, was limited to the local and Arab levels, including three major categories in each level: Individual Creative sports, Group Creative Sports, and Corporate Creative Sports.

Phase 2:

2012

LAUNCHING INTO THE INTERNATIONALISM



The 4th Edition (2012) expanded worldwide for recognition to the Corporate Creativity Category with a specific Technical Regulation. Thus, with this prestigious Award, Dubai has become a shining spot on creative sports in the UAE, the Arab World and Worldwide.

Levels of the Award



Local

Competition categories include Individual Sports Creativity, Group Sports Creativity and Corporate Sports Creativity in the UAE for creative works ,achieved on the local regional, continental, international or Olympic level



Arab

Competition categories include Individual Sports Creativity, Group Sports Creativity and Corporate Sports Creativity in the Arab world for creative works achieved on the Arab, regional, continental, international or Olympic level



Global

Competition revolves around the Corporate Sports Creativity Category for creative sports works achieved on the international level

Individual Sport Creativity

This award is given to Individuals such as players, coaches, referees, and administrators who have accomplished creative sports achievements on the local, Arab, continental or international level.



Group Sport Creativity

This award is given to sports groups which have achieved creative sports works on the local, Arab, continental or international level.





Corporate Sport Creativity

SPORTS PERSONALITIES

The International Sports Personality Award



H.E Imran Ahmed Khan

Islamic Republic of Pakistan

Prime Minister

1- For his efforts in making Pakistan known as one of the leading cricketing nations of the world. He captained the Pakistan team that won the 1992 Cricket World Cup, defeating England in the final.

2- An inspirational sports icon, he continues to inspire young people now as Prime Minister by raising the status of sports in general and cricket in particular and strengthening Pakistani society through sports. Today, half of the country's 221 million people describe themselves as cricket fans, and nearly 42,000 players are officially registered with the Pakistan Cricket Board.

3- In 2019, Prime Minister Imran Khan launched a landmark \$639 million initiative for the welfare of Pakistan's youth, providing scholarships and skill development opportunities to young men and women, including scholarships in sports. In June 2021, Prime Minister Imran Khan announced that a cricket ground would be established in each Pakistani village and district with over 4,000 playground.

The Arab Sports Personality Award



HE Shiekh Joaan Bin Hamad Al-Thani

Qatar

President of Qatar National Olympic Committee



1- For his achievements since taking over responsivity as President of Qatar National Olympic Committee in 2015, including the first success of Qatari athletes at the Tokyo Olympics, they won two gold medals and a bronze medal, and this was Qatar's best performance at the Olympics.

2- He also chaired the organizing committee of the 2015 World Handball Championship in Doha and contributed to Qatar hosting of many international sporting events, as well as the development of equestrian sports and the global success of Qatari horses.

3- He also led Qatar's successful bid to host the second Asian Games in 2030, and Doha hosted the inaugural continental championships for the first time in 2006.

WINNERS LOCAL AWARDS

1 - The Local Administrator Award



For winning the presidency of the Asian Boxing Confederation and being named vice president of the International Boxing Association.



2 - The Local Referee Award



For being the first Arab to be elected chief judge of the International Weightlifting Federation for People of Determination and for being a judge at the Paralympic Games for the seventh consecutive year.




3 - The Local Team Award

4 - The Local Organization Award




For the success and excellence in organizing the 2021 Paralympic Shooting World Cup for the 5th time in a row.




5 - The Local Coach Award

(prize divided equally between)



He is known as the dean of basketball coaches in the United Arab Emirates and has won 58 titles so far in his career at local, Gulf, Arab and continental levels. In 2001, he was voted the best coach in Asia. He is the first Emirati coach to succeed in leading a team to the podium at the continental level. He also took over the technical management of the UAE and Bahrain national teams.



For winning the Arabian Gulf Football League title in the 2018/2019 season for the first time in Sharjah Club's history since the start of the professional league, as well as winning the Arabian Gulf Super Cup 2019 and Sharjah Club's success for the first time in its history under his leadership. He was qualified for the AFC Champions League twice in a row and was voted the league's best coach in the 2018-2019 season.


1 - The Arab Athlete Award

For winning a historic gold medal in karate at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, the first Olympic gold medal for Arabs in karate.

swimming

For winning the gold medal in swimming at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, the first Arab Olympic medal in swimming 400m freestyle.



Soufiane El Bakkali Kingdom of Morocco

Athletics

For winning the gold medal in the 3000-metre steeplechase at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, making him the first Arab athlete to win Olympic gold in the 3000-metre steeplechase.



Tareg Ali Hamedi Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

for winning the silver medal in Karate at the Olympic Games in Tokyo 2020.



2 - The Arab Administrator Award



The first Arab and African woman to be elected President of the Players' Committee and a member of the Executive Council of the International Modern Pentathlon Federation.




3 - The Arab Referee Award



For being the first international karate referee to officiate 4 finals bouts at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and for being named the best African continental karate referee and receiving the Arab Excellence Award in Arbitration 2021.

4 - The Arab Team Award



Republic of Algeria

For winning the 2019 Africa Cup of Nations in Egypt and setting the African record for matches without defeat, as well as being named the best African team and for not losing in 39 consecutive matches

5 - The Arab Organization Award



Initiative (Al-Ahly Club economic group - self-financing)

It is an outstanding initiative that brings together various aspects of innovation, vision and access to best practices in institutional work. The initiative has been one of the main reasons for the sports institution in coping with a pandemic and achieving excellent results and lessons in institutional work, and the returns from the financial, human resources and knowledge-based initiative will continue for several years to come.

The International Organization Award





For their success and excellence in organizing the World Handball Championship in Egypt in the face of the global impact of the pandemic by taking an innovative approach to developing and implementing protocols to prevent the spread of COVID -19 and ensure the health and safety of all participants with more than 5,000 participants, a "medical bubble" was successfully established, which was praised by the International Olympic Committee for the organizational model and precautions taken during the tournament.


At the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games, he won 2 gold medals in the 100 - and 800-metre wheelchair races and broke the Paralympic record.



He won the silver medal at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games under difficult conditions and challenges


